Keene High School is the receiving school for the towns of Chesterfield, Harrisville, Keene, Marlborough, Marlow, Nelson, Stoddard, Surry, Westmoreland, and Winchester. Enrollment in grades 9 through 12 is 1,579 students. The average class size is approximately 22 students.

KHS is a comprehensive high school accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges which offers students a well-rounded academic program (approximately 195 course offerings) in a block format and numerous co-curricular (27 varsity teams and 38 clubs) activities.

Advanced Placement courses are offered in the areas of English, world languages, math, social studies, art and science.

KHS now offers a Virtual High School program where students can take on-line courses not offered at KHS. Over the past five years, approximately 70 percent of graduating seniors have pursued post-secondary education.

The staff at Keene High School has made a commitment to provide students opportunities to prepare them for the transition to higher education and the workforce. Efforts in this area have been greatly facilitated by partnerships with area businesses and industries.

Keene High School is the site of the Cheshire Career Center, one of 24 vocational schools in the state. The center offers programs in business and office education, human services, and technology and trades to students from Keene, Fall Mountain, and Monadnock Regional high schools.

The enrollment at Marlborough School in Kindergarten through grade 8 including Readiness is 183 students. Academic and related instruction and services are provided by 40 full and part-time staff.

Teachers plan and work in teams to develop a child-centered and integrated curriculum throughout the grades. The school's small size lends itself to an emphasis on the individual needs of students.

In addition to the regular academic instruction, Marlborough offers music, band, chorus, NHDI (dance), art, physical education, Spanish and computer technology, as well as, reading and resource room services.

The school is a member of the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) initiative whose goal is to improve student responsibility and community involvement and, thereby, increase student achievement.

Chesterfield School is the largest elementary school in SAU 29 with an enrollment of 332 students in grades K-8 who reside in Chesterfield, Spofford and West Chesterfield. Students in grades 9-12 attend Keene High School.

Chesterfield values and nurtures all members of the school community and is dedicated to creating an environment that respects diversity and ensures the social, physical, intellectual, creative, and emotional growth of every student.

Chesterfield employs 60 professionals. The school offers Spanish instruction in grades K-8, and has a full-time media generalist, guidance counselor, speech therapist, reading specialist, and nurse. The staff is responsible for implementing a wide range of instructional/support programs and services in all major subject areas. Special education and Title I reading and math support services are available for identified/eligible students. Chesterfield School offers a wide variety of co-curricular and special programs, and encourages all students to "Dream, Believe and Achieve."

Student enrollment in Keene's five elementary schools (kindergarten through grade 5) is 1,189. Enrollments in the schools range from 326 students at Symonds School to 174 at Wheelock School. The average student-teacher ratio at the elementary level is 17:2.

Because the neighborhood school concept is very important to the community, each of Keene's five elementary schools is located in a different part of the city and serves families that live in that area. This system has encouraged each school to develop its

own individual character, but because each teaches the same curriculum and comparable skills, all Keene elementary school children enter the middle school (at grade 6) with a similar academic background.

Recent initiatives at the elementary level that have enhanced the learning environment for children include full-day kindergarten, an emphasis on the use of technology in the classroom, a mathematics curriculum initiative, a core reading program, world language instruction, the Collins Writing Program, the re-introduction of the social curriculum, peer mediation, and after school programs.

Close collaboration with Keene State College and Antioch University New England for pre-service teaching experiences, continued volunteer efforts and strong community support contribute to the success of Keene's elementary schools.

Each of the five schools is committed to providing a quality educational program to each child in a positive and highly-motivating environment.

Approximately 584 students in grades 6 through 8 attend Keene Middle School (KMS). A staff of 71 certified professionals provide students with a balanced academic program and co-curricular opportunities.

KMS receives students from several sending towns — sixth, seventh and eighth graders from Keene, Surry and Stoddard, and seventh and eighth grade students from Marlow, Nelson and Harrisville.

KMS's staff demonstrates the strongest commitment to the middle school concept. This places an emphasis on positive student-teacher relationships and a responsiveness to the interests and needs (academic, social, and emotional) of young adolescents.

KMS practices include continual strengthening of a challenging curriculum, enrichment activities, small student advisory groups, instructional teams, and flexible scheduling to meet student needs.
